Greetings and Grace to you all.

"Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith, as you are being rooted and grounded in love." — Ephesians 3:17—

This past month, we gathered, opened the word in worship, and pondered on the gift of Love ... And the movement of God's love down upon us, in us, and flowing out of us. Breathe OUT your shame.


Repeat your breaths
