PASTOR PATTI'S PONDERINGS

Cultivate Love through Epiphanies ... think ah-ha moments. Epiphanies are about manifestations, enlightenment, bringing light into our darkness. According to the Oxford Dictionary, Manifestation refers to an event, action or thing that is a sign that something exists or is happening.

And so, we look at stories during this Time after Epiphany to learn more about God through Jesus. We will experience miracles, watch on as Jesus is rejected and led to the side of the cliff, and be present in his teachings. We will learn what it means to be a disciple and even how to love; and in all this, we hopefully learn how strong, powerful and abundant God's love and grace is for us.

Our Synodical theme this month is "Cultivating Love through Epiphanies." And so, let's ponder through these weeks on how each story can enlighten us as to how God is at work in our lives and in the lives of the community we live in, here at First and our neighborhood. And let's take it even a step further than that. And ask, "Am I sharing what I am learning with the rest of my world?"

Are you using some of the Faith Forward tools that I have shared to connect with others in your family ... or friends? Have you shared your faith with anyone lately? Have you used any of the prayer practices that I have introduced to you?

How are we Cultivating Love with one another and with our neighbors?

Can we, in this season of Epiphany, ponder on these stories we hear and challenge ourselves and one another to find new insights and wisdom? And then we can recognize the questions God might be providing and calling us to see and dwell in.

Questions for pondering: How are you sensing God active in your life? Is God calling you to sense and see something in new light? Is God calling this faith community to sense and see something in new light? Are you forever changed as a beloved disciple and Child of God?

In this month of February, we will observe some very special dates: Super Bowl, Valentine's Day and President's Day. Winter continues and maybe we experience the hope that comes as days begin to grow longer and spring starts to come near. How might these observations provide intentional opportunities in your life and in the life of our faith community for conversations, discoveries and epiphanies?

On behalf of the congregation and Council, I want to thank Pastor Patti for taking the time to meet our members, attend various committees, and lead us in our Sunday services. Pastor goes above and beyond by planning and preparing for our church services from her preparation through bulletins, music, and especially for her ponderings/messages as our spiritual leader. Her services have led our attendance to stabilize and moderately increase.

Thanks to the Church Council for their leadership and stewardship for the good of the church. Thanks to the congregational members for all that they do behind the scenes for the betterment of the church. I enjoy observing the friendly and welcoming atmosphere at First Lutheran Church. Please consider coming and sharing in the coffee gatherings before and after church service.

Being a person who deals with financials, I would be remise not to mention our financials, 2025 budget and 2026 outlook. Thus far, 2024 has exceeded last year's budget which is great. Our 2025 budget utilized 2024 weekly giving along with a generous contribution of \$12,000 to be utilized for 2025 operating expenses. While that is an amazing gift, the church/congregation will be challenged to increase our weekly giving of \$2,315 to \$2,540 in 2026 to offset that generous gift.

Our congregation needs to consider establishing a growth trajectory for members and giving to sustain our current position while hopefully transitioning towards a long-term goal of hiring a full-time pastor. As we ponder on our longterm goals, please take some time to watch a video or read the book "Canoeing the Mountains" as it offers relatable issues from a Lewis and Clark perspective about the church and religion.

LENT IS FAST APPROACHING

Worship Planning and Fellowship Committees met together in January to begin preparing for Lent, so we could give you a heads-up with our plans. Ash Wednesday is March 5 and there will be regular worship with communion at 6:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary.

Midweek worship on March 12, 19, 26, April 2 and 9 will meet in the Fellowship Hall. There will be Soup and Dessert beginning at 5:30 p.m. (come when you can) and worship/study will begin at 6:00 p.m. This is set up so that if you cannot get there until almost 6:00, you can still grab a bowl and eat through the worship/study.

The Confirmation class is studying "The Lord's Prayer" during the Lent season and so our Midweek gatherings this year will be a 40-day journey through Lent in the Lord's Prayer. Each of the Confirmation students will take a turn to help with leading the weekly worship/study.

Please come and eat good food, support our Confirmation students, and learn more about the Lord's Prayer through this study. I can tell you that I first attended this study back in 2009 and it changed how I pray. It changed how I "see" the words of the Lord's Prayer. It changed me and my relationship with God. We will follow a book that has a devotion and study questions

each day for the 40 days. You can get a book and follow along as your Lenten devotion this year or you can just come and join in the discussions each week. There will be a sign-up sheet at the Welcome Desk if you would like a book and don't want to order it



yourself. (They run \$11.99 through Augsburg Fortress, but you might be able to find it for less on Amazon or one of the used bookstores online). This is a great devotional study through the Lenten season even if you don't plan to attend the Midweek events.

LOVINGKINDNESS MEDITATION

Let yourself sit in a comfortable fashion. Let your body rest and be relaxed. Let your heart be soft. Let go of any plans or preoccupations.

Begin with yourself ... (because without loving yourself it is almost impossible to love others). Breathe gently and recite inwardly the following traditional phrases directed toward your own well-being:

May I be filled with lovingkindness. May I be safe from inner and outer dangers. May I be well in body and mind. May I be at ease and happy.

As you repeat these phrases, picture yourself and hold that image in a heart of lovingkindness. Let any feelings that come forth permeate your body and mind.

When you feel you have established some stronger sense of lovingkindness for yourself, you can then expand your meditation to include others. Choose a benefactor, someone in your life who has loved and truly cared for you. Picture this person and carefully recite the same phrases, replacing "May you" ... for "May I"...

Spend time wishing well to a wider circle of friends. Gradually extend your meditation to picture and include neighbors, community members, healthcare workers, marginalized people, people everywhere, all beings, the whole earth.

Finally, include the difficult people in your life, even your enemies, wishing they too may be filled with lovingkindness and peace. As you practice this meditation it will calm your mind and keep you connected to your heart.

FOOD BANK VOCABULARY

Do you know what these terms mean? In the world of food banking, we use a unique vocabulary that may be unfamiliar to some. Let's break down the difference between a food desert and a food swamp!

Food deserts and food swamps are classifications for the lack of nutritious foods in a specific area. Food deserts refer to areas with limited access to affordable and nutritious foods, typically where the nearest grocery store is more than 30 minutes away. Food swamps, on the other hand, describe areas with a high density of unhealthy food options and very few grocery stores. A common ratio for food swamps is four unhealthy options for every healthy option.
